- √ Thinking Creativity – Rate yourself in these areas on a scale of 1 (poor) to 10 (exceptional):

I make connections between seemingly unrelated ideas.	
I reshape goals in ways that reveal new possibilities.	

- √ Solving Problems – Rate yourself in these areas on a scale of 1 (poor) to 10 (exceptional):

SOLVING PROBLEMS	RATING 1-10
I recognize that there is a discrepancy between what is and what should or could be.	
I identify possible reasons for any discrepancy.	
I devise and implement a plan of action to resolve the problem.	
I evaluate and monitor progress.	
I revise plans as indicated by findings.	

When you demonstrate proficiency in these skills, it instills confidence in an employer.

If you rated yourself highly, then you're in great shape. If you rated yourself lower, do you want to strengthen those skills? What is the most easeful and fun way to be more proficient?
